IRIS Marks our 25th Anniversary!

In 1973, volunteers read the Des Moines Register aloud for the first time. The service was a part of the Iowa Department for the Blind and the signal was limited to about 100 listeners in the Des Moines area. In 1986, budget issues threatened to silence the service and the volunteer readers swung into action!

They faced plenty of challenges from funding to logistics, yet they conquered each one until the Iowa Radio Reading Service for the Blind and Print Handicapped was born. In late August of 1989, the first Voices of IRIS were on the air!

This year, we celebrate that first independent broadcast in 1989. We've grown to serve our 24/7 signal to over 3,000 listeners statewide. We've grown to employ two paid staff and seven reading locations. We've grown to provide internet streaming, podcasts and mobile device access. We've grown to provide Audio Description for blind patrons at theater performances and community events.

Through it all, we've held fast to the two most important visions of our founders. First, all IRIS services and equipment are still provided at no cost to our listeners. Second, we are an organization of volunteers. From our Board of Directors to the voices you hear each day, the contributions of over 500 volunteers remain the power and soul of IRIS. It simply does not happen without them.

We ask two things of YOU:

Share Your Story!

We're compiling a History of IRIS. Take a minute to write or call to tell us what IRIS means to you. Whether you are a listener, volunteer or family member, we want to know a bit more about you and the ways in which IRIS fits into your lives.
